

HTXelerator reaches halfway point, announces inaugural cohort of future council members and board/commission members

Boasts comprehensive advisory board, mentor, and speaker list

25 future-focused class members comprise our 2021 Class

HOUSTON, TX, Nov. 1, 2021 – The HTXelerator inaugural cohort is now halfway through the HTXeleator program, set to end on December 15th, 2021. The class is filled with 25 engaged and talented Houstonians from around the city and a variety of backgrounds including technology and real estate professionals, entrepreneurs, educators, and CEOs.

"Despite the uncertainties of the global pandemic which has resulted in the canceling or postponement of many popular events and programs in Houston, interest in the HTXelerator remains high," said HTXelerator Executive Director Randy Romman. "This is the initial launch of the program and we have a full cohort."

When the 2021 HTXelerator concludes in mid-December, it will include 25 alumni, advisory members and mentors that include former elected officials, and a one-of-a-kind speaker list from leaders of the public and private sectors.

The HTXelerator, a nonpartisan 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, is the only elected office candidate recruitment engine in Houston. It is designed to identify, mentor and promote the next generation of future-focused leaders interested in public service. The 25 individuals selected for the Class of 2021 have a standout dedication and commitment to the future success of Houston and to serving our community through public service.

HTXelerator participants receive rigorous training and mentorship by experienced elected officials and community leaders. The 2021 HTXelerator curriculum included more than 30 subject-matter experts including Former Houston Mayor Annise Parker, Founding Director of the Kinder Institute for Urban Research, Dr. Stephen L. Klineberg Texas, Chief Operating Officer & Deputy City Controller, Alexander W. Obregon, among others. Each class member is also assigned a mentor, typically a current or former elected official or a professional with experience working in and around city council.

The class's opening retreat was held on September 11-12, 2021, and is followed by nine weekly Wednesday sessions taught by experts in the fields of transportation, land use, utilities, economic development, homelessness, diversity and social equity, and a variety of other issues intended to prepare future candidates and city board and commission members. The closing retreat is scheduled to take place in December 2021 on media training, how to run a campaign and class project presentations followed by a pitch-style competition before an expert panel of judges and a public event for nine finalists, the HTXL Games.

The mission of the HTXelerator is to identify and prepare future-focused leaders for public service and educate the community about solutions that will improve Houston's quality of life for generations to come. The program aims to encourage citizens to pursue and prepare for elected office and board/commission service through a technology accelerator model.
